This helps keep usable materials out of the landfill. The Victoria store carries a variety of goods including flooring, paint, lighting of every description, kitchen and bathroom cabinets, tools, lumber, roofing materials, sinks, bathtubs, toilets, interior/exterior doors, windows and hardware. The stock changes constantly.

Revenues raised are used to fund the construction of affordable housing in the Capital Region for lower income families. Every \$60,000 raised by the Victoria ReStore will provide a family of 4 with a home of their own. #### From Carolyn's Kitchen... Savoury Italian Bake

1 box of chicken Rice-a-Roni
1lb. Italian Sausage (mild or hot)
1/2 c chopped onion
3 sm. zucchini - 1/4 inch slices
1 clove of garlic minced
2 1/2 c spaghetti sauce
1/2 tsp. basil
2 c shredded mozzarella

Make rice according to pkg. directions. Skin sausage and fry with onion until brown and crumbled. Remove meat from pan and add zucchini slices and garlic. Stir fry 2 min. In a casserole dish combine rice mixture, sausage, basil and 1 1/2 c. of the sauce. Top with zucchini, and layer remaining sauce and cheese on top. Bake @ 350 for 25-30 minutes.
