OLIVE ONION BISCUIT BREAD

2 cups Biscuit Mix
2 tbsp Fresh parsley, chopped
2/3 cup cold water
I large onion, diced
2 tbsp butter
I/2 cup sour cream or yogurt
I egg beaten
I tsp dried dillweed
3/4 cup olives chopped
salt & pepper to taste

Preheat oven to 450 F,
Combine biscuit mix, parsley and cold water. Spoon into a greased 9 inch (2L) pan.
Sauté onions in butter until golden brown, Season lightly with salt and pepper.
Combine sour cream (or yogurt), egg, dillweed and olives. Add onions and mix.
Spoon over bread.
Bake 20 minutes.let cool in pan 10 min. before slicing.

MARKET UPDATE THE FLATLINE FORECAST

JACK SAYS:

Moving from one property to another, still a very good time to do so! It is a good time to buy an additional property for revenue or investment purposes.

Moving up in value will give a small \$ gain and moving down could incur a small \$ loss. Prices will not move down noticeably but could remain level for several years. Interest rates however could climb a little in the next couple of years.

Information below taken from BCREA March 14/13

"Residential values are expected to be on a more solid footing in 2013 as lower prices, both actual and inflation adjusted, have improved affordability. Many potential buyers that stayed on the sidelines in 2012 will likely enter the marketplace over the next year as the relatively strong financial condition of BC households precludes any deflationary spiral."

The average MLS® residential price in BC is forecast to edge down nearly 1 per cent to \$510,400 this year and remain relatively unchanged in 2014, albeit up 0.6 per cent to \$513,500.
